About

This scholarship was created in loving memory of Colin Harwood-McCollester, a non-traditional student in the Psychology Department at the University of Arizona who loved academics and thoughtful discussions of psychology, and who had a heart committed to help others. The Colin Harwood-McCollester Undergraduate Scholarship in Psychology provides support to students facing financial barriers or other challenges that may seem insurmountable.

Eligibility for Applicants

- Full-time undergraduate student majoring in Psychology or Psychological Science
- Financial need or inability to obtain Federal Financial Aid
- Preference for non-traditional students. Non-traditional students have the following characteristics: older than typical age, being independent of parents, working full time while enrolled, having dependents, being a single parent, and being a recipient of a GED or high school completion certificate.
