

## Psychology Minor

- The Psychology minor consists of a total of 18 PSY units; 9 units must be **upper division (300-400 level)**.
- At least 9 units must be taken at the University of Arizona.
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 to declare the minor.
- A minimum minor GPA of 2.00 in order to graduate with the Psychology minor.

\*If you completed *PSY 150A1: Structure of Mind and Behavior* and are using it towards your General Education requirements, then the units cannot also be used towards the Psychology minor. Students will be required to take another Psychology course to fulfill the unit requirement. This is also applicable if PSY 101 transfer credit has been applied to Tier I General Education requirements.

Students cannot take both PSY 101 and 150A1.

Any PSY course that you meet eligibility for can be taken as a PSY Elective with the exception of PSY 150A1, PSY 101 or other PSY courses previously taken.

No more than 3 units of Internship, Practicum, Preceptorship or Independent Studies can be applied to the minor.

Double Use of Minor Course Work: Psychology courses used in other major's PreMajor requirements (i.e., FSHD, PreNursing, etc.) can be used in the minor as well but please always double check with an Advisor in Psychology to be sure.

Many Psychology courses are restricted to declared Psychology majors and minors during priority registration. After the priority registration period has ended, most Psychology courses will be open to minors if there are still seats available. It is the student's responsibility to check UAccess for availability of courses.

A number of Psychology courses (all online) are offered during summer and winter sessions, and are open to all students.
